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IUCLID AND PESTICIDES

IUCLID (International Uniform ChemicaL Information Database) is one of the most used applications in Europe for reporting on chemicals. This software allows to register, archive, present and exchange data on the intrinsic and hazardous properties of substances in the OHT format. IUCLID allows to notify the active of a biocidal substances and prepare the product dossier according to the BPR, REACH and CLP regulations, But it has also recently been tested for pesticides and to meet the transparency requirements that will come into force in March 2021. The suitability of the IUCLID software was tested by Knoell in a pilot project directly commissioned by EFSA.A.

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ECHA PROPOSES A RESTRICTION ON INTENTIONAL USES OF MICROPLASTICS



ECHA proposed to restrict intentionally-added microplastics for reducing emissions from intentional uses. Following an extensive consultation in 2019, the Agency updated its proposal following a transparent and evidence-based scientific approach. All changes made are based on strong arguments and evidence received during a biannual stakeholder consultation, which took place from March to September 2019. Updates have been introduced on the definition of microplastics and for managing risks from polymeric infill used in artificial turf pitches. The overall goal of all the changes was to ensure that the restriction works and can be applied efficiently, without at the same time delaying the reduction of microplastic emissions. The RAC supports the ECHA proposal and provides recommendations on some aspects.

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KKIDIK (TURKISH REACH): PREREGISTRATION DEADLINE SET ON 31/12/2020.



In 2017, Turkey published and consolidated the text of the KKIDIK regulation regarding chemicals that can be placed on local national market. The scheme adopted follows the European REACH regulation in many prescriptions, so much so that it is often referred to as Turkey-REACH. One of the significant differences is that there is only one registration deadline for all tonnage bands, set for 31/12/2023.

At this stage, the possibility is open to pre-register by 31/12/2020.
